THANK YOU for your support of the FJGC **REAL ID REQUIREMENT - OCTOBER 2020!**

Department of Homeland Security has granted South Carolina's request for extension to become REAL ID compliant. The latest extension expires on October 2020. Starting next October, Fort Jackson will no longer accept South Carolina Driver's License as the sole form of identification. Though it is NOT mandatory for a SC resident to get a SC REAL ID DL, but for entry onto military installations, air travel, etc. REAL ID is required. Golf Club members/patrons without a form of identification that is REAL ID compliant are encouraged to obtain the South Carolina REAL ID Driver's License. If a person elects not to get a REAL ID. they must provide additional identification in order to access the Installation. Acceptable forms of identification are as follows:

Proof of Identity (examples: Birth certificate or valid US Passport), Proof of Social Security Number (examples: Social Security card or W-2 Form that has your social security number and name and your employer's name), Two Proofs of Current, Physical SC Address (examples: current, unexpired SC license or ID and a no more than 90-day-old utility bill with

the same name and address). Proof of all legal name changes (examples: marriage license or court order issued by your county's probate or family court. One must show a complete name change history that links your birth certificate name to your present day name. If you have a valid US Passport or US Passport Card with your legal name, you may use that as your name change document.

Make the next twelve months the year you dedicate yourself to lowering that handicap. Becoming a member of the FJGC Range Club is a great first step. The yearly membership to the Range Club is only \$225. Each additional Family member can be added to a Range Club Membership for an additional



\$25 per person. Each Range Club member will be issued two range ball bags. Before each practice session, simply return your empty bags to the Golf Shop and exchange them for two full bags. Any lost or missing bags can be replaced for a \$5 charge. **Effective Oct 1, 2019 Range Club Membership will be \$275, additional family members \$50 per person. We would like to remind ALL Range Club Members that your range balls are for your personal use only and

cannot be shared with another person. We also ask that you NOT keep filled bags of range balls in your vehicle. The storage of balls in your vehicle greatly REDUCES the number of balls available to our patrons. In turn, this requires us to collect balls off the range more frequently and increases our labor costs. Of course, increased costs will be passed along to all of our customers!

<u>Titleist TS Drivers.</u> Light weight driver offerings are not new in the world of golf. Aimed at launch and distance for players with moderate swing speeds, Titleist is introducing the new TS1 into their Speed Project lineup. The TS1 are in stores now and comes with a total package weight of 275 grams. There are so many golfers that can benefit from the performance of

TS1. Seniors, women and juniors - really anyone who is the moderate swing speed player - TS1 is an absolute powerhouse. You can swing as smooth and easy as you want and the ball just takes off. The distance just feels effortless. With the four new TS models - TS1, TS2, TS3 and TS4 - any golfer who walksinto a fitting can find a Titleist driver that will max out their speed and performance. The TS1 still has the same things found in the rest of the TS line of drivers. Titanium crown, the thinnest face Titleist has ever put out, and a streamlined shape for aerodynamics. the TS1 is designed to launch it high. to accomplish that, Titleist has a deep center of gravity, when comparing it to the previous line extension of the TS4, which moved the weight forward, this not only will give the added spin necessary, but also offer highter MOI. Titleist has given us two premium standard shaft options. the Fujikura Air Speeder, which is the highest launching shaft in the Titleist Shaft Matrix and the Mitsubishi Fubuki MV, which although it comes in at 5 grams heavier, offers a little less spin. Out of the two options, the Mitsubishi could be a real star here offering a lot of balance in launch and spin without much sacrifice in weight. Important to note that the TS1 standard length comes in at 45.75. compared to the 45.5 of the original release. The TS1 fills a void that was missing from their lineup, and in some ways shows a new Titleist, one that is looking to cater towards all golfers. While we still prefer a driver lineup to be released together, the release of this light weight offering definitely gives another option for the golfer, which is always a positive. HANDICAP CART POLICY

Recently, numerous concerns have been voiced regarding abuse of the Handicap Cart Policy. In order to obtain enhanced cart access due to physical limitations, one must submit the required documentation to the Admin Office which is then reviewed by members of the GAC. Patrons are reminded that carts MUST be kept at least 20 feet from the putting surfaces. Also, carts are NOT permitted between the green and bunkers. Everyone's cooperation is greatly appreciated.
