# **REAL ID REQUIREMENT - OCTOBER 2020!**

Department of Homeland Security has granted South Carolina's request for extension to become REAL ID compliant. The latest extension expires on October 2020. Starting next October, Fort Jackson will no longer accept South Carolina Driver's License as the sole form of identification. Though it is NOT mandatory for a SC resident to get a SC REAL ID DL, but for entry onto military installations, air travel, etc. REAL ID is required.

Golf Club members/patrons without a form of identification that is REAL ID compliant are encouraged to obtain the South Carolina REAL ID

Driver's License.

If a person elects not to get a REAL ID, they must provide additional identification in order to access the Installation. Acceptable forms of identification are as follows:

**Proof of Identity** (examples: Birth certificate or valid US Passport),

**Proof of Social Security Number** (examples: Social Security card or W-2 Form that has your social security number and name and your employer's name).

Two Proofs of Current, Physical SC Address (examples: current, unexpired SC license or ID and a no more than 90-day-old utility bill with the same name and address).

Proof of all legal name changes (examples: marriage license or court order issued by your county's probate or family court. One must show a complete name change history that links your birth certificate name to your present day name. If you have a valid US Passport or US Passport Card with your legal name, you may use that as your name change document.



# ON THE COURSE...

The fall season is here and this year we are approaching the winter in the best conditions we have been in years. All the greens are fully grassed we are currently repairing the damaged collars and soon we will be sodding a couple of the bad spots in the fairways. Since this April when the Upper and Lower Legion Dam project was completed, we are now fully operational with the irrigation needs and the courses are getting back to being maintained at the highest level. The Greens Staff deserves a huge hand for the condition of the courses



The Bobcat Greens are now open for play but are not quite 100%, they will continue to have topdressing sand on them to keep the grass growing as long as possible to finish the growing season. This spring

we will have them complete and ready for the summer season.

Now we will progress into the slower winter months where we will tackle the dead trees (record numbers) of pines and hardwoods. The bunkers will continue to be addressed adding more sand and adjusting to the ones with high and low amounts, drainage issues too. We also have a couple of greens that have drainage issues along the edges and we will be addressing those areas as well. The staff has just finished applying the fall pre-emerge to keep the winter poa down to a minimum and we applied a product to the greens that will keep it off the greens this year better than in years past.

# **Callaway PM Grind Wedge:**

With last year's Mack Daddy 4, Callaway introduced what it calls micro-positive ridges. Not entirely unique to Callaway (most manufacturers have some form of the technology), it's easy to understand why the company calls it groove-in-groove technology. What's different with the PM Grind is that Callaway has offset the micro-grooves at a 20°. The contention is that the offset grooves help increase spin when the wedge is laid open-and if you're going to put a PM Grind in the bag, the perfectly reasonable assumption is that you're going to lay it open on the reg. Callaway is claiming that offset groove-in-groove technology provides 12% more spin on lob shots. That's a significant amount, though we'd be remiss not to point out that the number is based on robot testing, which almost invariably means off a tee in perfectly dry conditions. Whether or not that translates to the golf course remains to be seen.

# **The Titleist EXP-01**

The "EXP" represents "Experimental," is a limited run prototype that the company's R&D team is hoping to learn from as it develops the company's next urethane-cover ball. While the ususal new product cycle for Titleist's flagship urethane cover balls, Pro VI and Pro V1x, would have new versions of those balls reaching retail in early 2021, this prototype seems to be a departure from the line. While the arrival of EXP -01 seems similar to the company's AVX product timeline (it was introduced two years ago as a limited run before becoming a full-run product in the spring of 2018), there's been no mention of the next AVX. Instead, it's this prototype that features a new core chemistry and a new kind of urethane cover formulation, what the company is calling MTR Developmental Cover System. Titleist is mum on what MTR stands for, only saying that it features "short game spin enhancing urethane." Underneath the cover is a new core and mantle layer construction, designed for "high speed...and low spin on long game shots." Its 346-dimple pattern is distinct from current urethane cover Titleist balls, including the 352-dimple Pro V1, the 328-dimple Pro V1x and the 352 tetrahedral catenary dimples on the AVX. The Titleist EXP-01 is available for a limited time in the U.S. and Canada and at the My Titleist section of titleist.com (\$40 a dozen).

## **NEW SNACK BAR HOURS OF OPERATION**

## **HANDICAP CART POLICY**

Recently, numerous concerns have been voiced regarding abuse of the Handicap Cart Policy. In order to obtain enhanced cart access due to physical limitations, one must submit the required documentation to the Admin Office which is then reviewed by members of the GAC. Patrons are reminded that carts MUST be kept at least 20 feet from the putting surfaces. Also, carts are NOT permitted between the green and bunkers. Everyone's cooperation is greatly appreciated.
